

1. **Research Title:** Micro-Structured Devices for Nanoparticle Toxicity Screening
2. **Individual Sponsor:** Name: Saber Hussain, PhD  
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3. **Academic Area/Field and Education Level:** Engineering (especially Biomedical, Materials, and Mechanical, other research relevant concentrations considered), pursuing M.S. or Ph.D.
4. **Objectives:** Design and validate microstructurally accurate and physiologically relevant *in vitro* models, such as those incorporating microfluidic devices or micropatterned substrates, to better replicate whole organs for advanced toxicity screening purposes.
5. **Description:** Man-made nanoparticles (NPs) are being applied in numerous aerospace technologies, with yet unknown health risks associated from unintentional exposure. Currently employed methods for investigating health risks due to NP exposure suffer from many limitations, including a lack of physiological relevance and the inability to mimic *in vivo* behavior. Therefore, advanced *in vitro* models that mimic whole organs are critical for accurate predicative modeling of nanotoxicological phenomena. Microstructure design, shear flow and mechanical flexure have been shown to facilitate the ability of synthetic devices to mimic whole organ responses. The key phases of the project will include a review of recent bioengineered approaches, design of a novel, advanced *in vitro* model for NP toxicity testing, and validation of the constructed platform through the generation of meaningful toxicological data following NP exposure.
6. **Potential Commercial Impact and Industry Involvement:** The potential impact of this technology is to lessen the use of animal models for toxicity testing, thus reducing cost and ethical concerns and increasing throughput. These capabilities are useful and relevant in a broad range of industries where toxicity and health risks due to NP exposure are a concern.
